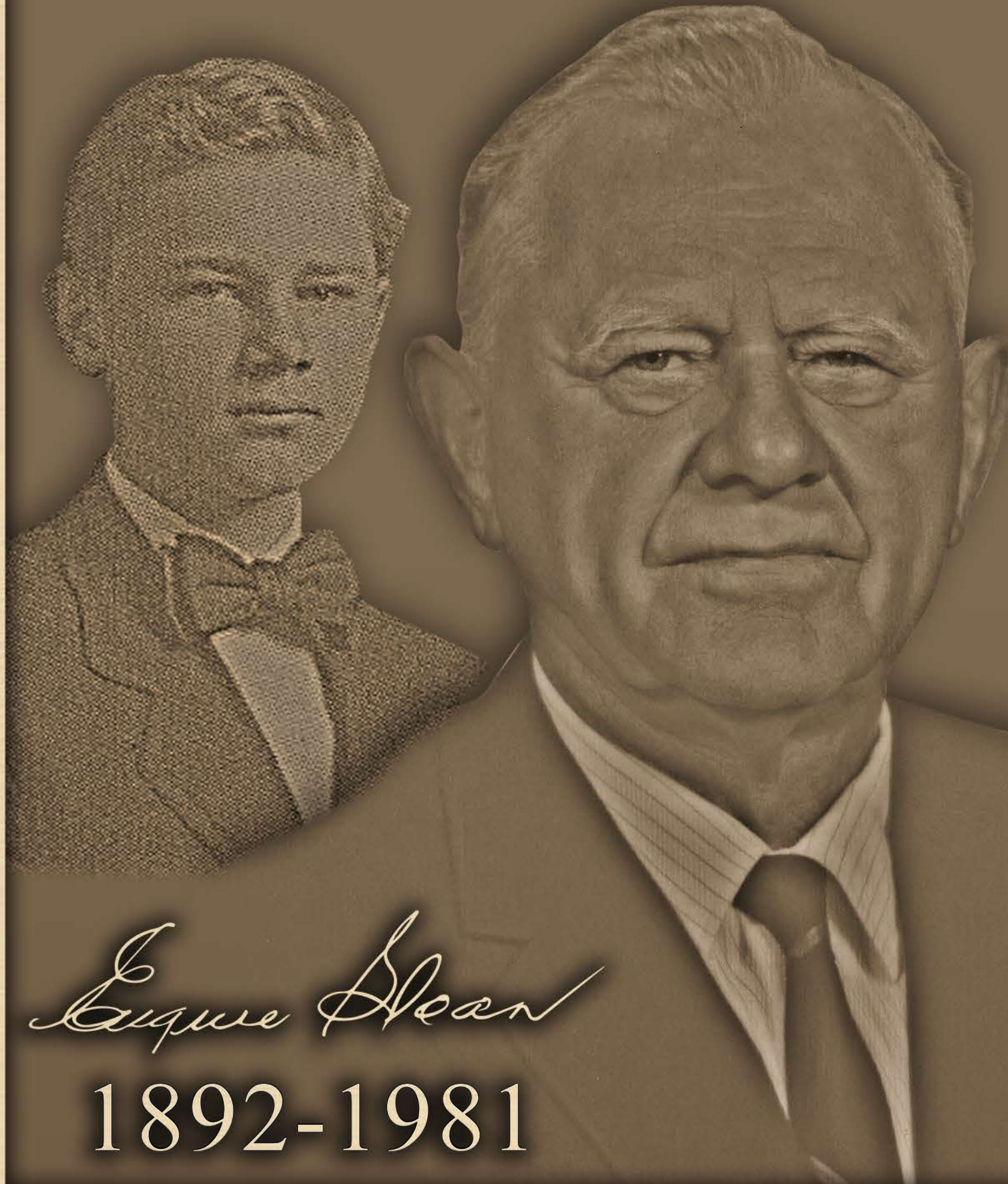


Eugene Sloan Auditorium



A graduate in Arkansas College's Class of 1912, Eugene Sloan was a life-long supporter of the school that changed its name to Lyon College in 1994. Eugene was born into a Lawrence County family with deep Scots-Irish Presbyterian roots. They valued education in general and Arkansas College in particular. His father, three brothers, and other relatives also graduated from here.

On campus, Eugene earned the Coffin Medal, the school's highest academic award, as well as extracurricular honors. Arkansas College prepared him to excel at Vanderbilt Law School, after which he became a prominent attorney in Jonesboro, Arkansas. Eugene and his wife, Beatrice Lynch, had three children and 18 grandchildren.

In 2017, the family decided to commemorate Eugene Sloan's dedication to his alma mater and devotion to his Presbyterian faith by supporting renovation of this chapel auditorium in his name.
