

COLONEL ROBERT N. "SPEED" HULLEY

June 20, 1929 - August 2, 2010

Colonel Hulley was born June 20, 1929 at Sturgis, Michigan. In 1946, he graduated from Lawton High School and entered the Army Air Force in September of 1947. He was stationed in the Philippines and Okinawa. Subsequently he attended the United States Military Academy at West Point and was a graduate of the 1952 class. Colonel Hulley retired from the U.S. Army on November 30, 1976, at Fort Sill, where he had been assigned as Provost Marshal. He was a veteran of World War II, Korea and Vietnam and served with the Military Police Corp.

His awards include: the National Defense Service Medal with First Oak Leaf Cluster, Defense Service Agency Meritorious Service Award, Republic of Korea Presidential Unit Citation, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, Meritorious Unit Commendation (3rd Award), Combat Infantryman Badge, Vietnam Service Medal, Korean Service Medal, World War II Victory Medal, Army of Occupation Medal (Japan), Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, United Nations Service Medal, Ranger Tab and Parachutist Badge.
