Mount Pleasant Fire Department Station 1 is officially named by the Town of Mount Pleasant to honor the leadership, service, and dedication of Fire Chief Frederick Tetor.

During his distinguished career from 1975 to 2002, Chief Tetor served as the President of the Tri-County Firefighter's Association and as a member of the Governor's Task Force for Hazardous Materials. He helped to establish the modern volunteer firefighters program and led the Mount Pleasant Fire Department to become the first internationally-accredited fire department in the state of South Carolina. Chief Tetor also played an integral role in the development of the South Carolina Firefighters Employment and Registration Act.

Chief Tetor recognized the importance of honor and integrity and worked diligently to bring professionalism to the forefront of the fire service. May those who serve in this department honor Chief Frederick Tetor's legacy by remaining prepared, professional, and willing to serve the citizens of the Town of Mount Pleasant.
